Bria Hammel used light wood stain as a goes-with-everything backdrop for planters and seasonal decor.

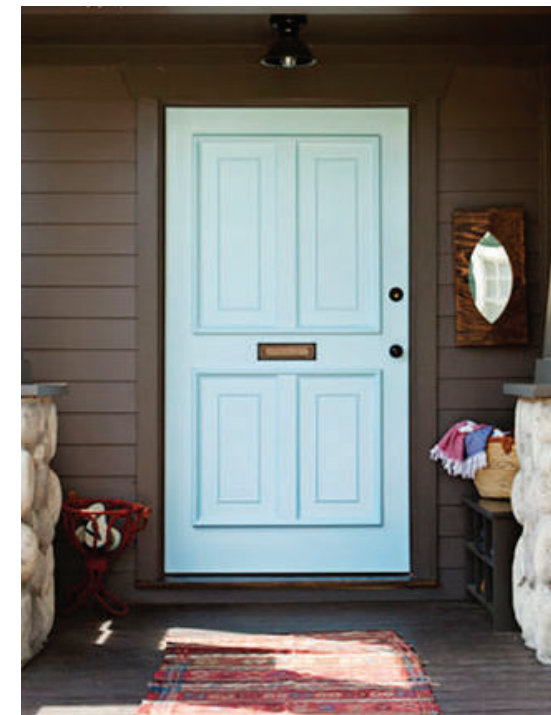
